Online learning allows students to learn at their own pace. 7. SWOT Analysis

Our Strengths

- The School is a well-known primary school in Hong Kong.
- The School has maintained close and congenial relationships with the PTA, our alumni and La Salle College.
- The School has established strong networks and connections with different stakeholders.
- The School has maintained good home-school cooperation with strong parental support.
- The School has a strong team of dedicated and self-motivated teachers.
- The School has a broad and well-balanced curriculum which caters for students' diverse needs and interests.
- The School has well-equipped hardware and software which enable the implementation of various teaching strategies stimulating students' learning interests.
- Students are highly motivated with capabilities to soar in both academic and non-academic aspects.

Our Weaknesses

- Attention has to be paid to learner's diversity in each class.
- Some students lack parental support.
- Due to the pandemic, students lack opportunities to work collaboratively with others.
- Special attention has to be paid to those students who have short attention span.
- Teachers need further training to handle SEN students.

Our Opportunities

- Due to the pandemic, students and teachers have more opportunities to familiarise themselves with new forms of technology.
- Students and teachers are better equipped with 21st century skills and adapt to different learning modes.
- There are more chances to promote self-directed learning by using various e-Learning tools.
- More teacher professional development on catering for the needs of SEN students allows the School to provide stronger support for SEN students.
- Collaborative lesson planning has helped teachers to be able to share insights and good practices.
- With the extension of IBL Project Week/Day to other levels, students' talents will be further developed.

Our Threats

- There is increasingly strong competition from other schools such as Direct-subsidy Scheme schools, private schools and international schools.
- The rate of technology advancement is a big challenge in education.
- Some parents are overprotective. This hinders students from self-directed learning and increases the challenges of home-school cooperation.
- Aging school facilities will need huge resource consumption which imposes a financial burden on the School.
- Due to the pandemic, students lack opportunities for group activities, off-campus visits and intercollegiate competitions. The imbalance between academic learning and extracurricular activities results in students becoming stressed and not well equipped with interpersonal skills.
