I am always touched when I hear the story of Peter Hans Amandus Ulrich (picture on the right). He was a graduate of La Salle College and was a top student. He won a government scholarship to attend the University of Hong Kong in 1935. He returned to teach at LSC probably in 1939 and was also a Scout Master. Apart from being an outstanding scholar, Peter was also active on the sports front. He represented La Salle in athletics and football when he was a student. In 1941, Peter became the 2nd President of the Old Boys' Association and the only one to die in office when he was 25 years old.

I would like to express my gratitude to the PTA and the Heritage Sub-committee of the La Salle Old Boys' Association for organising this meaningful event.
