ACHIEVABLE

It means you are setting goals that you can accomplish.

RELEVANT

It means your goal make sense, it is worth your effort, it benefits you and meets your needs.

TIME-BOUND

It means there is a time frame for your goal.

Tip: answer "when" questions (one week, every week, etc.)




LEAD School Leaders Congress 2025




As part of the 150th Anniversary of the Lasallian Mission in Hong Kong, the LEAD School Leaders Congress 2025 was held in Hong Kong with 120 delegates from seven countries in Asia. It began with a pre-congress online session on 6th November. This virtual gathering set the tone by familiarising delegates with the city, the congress programme, and logistical details.

The Congress was held at the Royal Plaza Hotel in Mong Kok on 8th and 9th December. It featured a rich programme of reflection, keynote addresses, and collaborative sharing. Br. Armin Luistro FSC delivered a keynote on global developments, followed by sector presentations and reflections. Delegates spent the afternoon sharing school-level practices, and Dr. Joseph Lee GBS, JP spoke on the role of alumni and other schools in sustaining the Lasallian mission. The next day, there was a keynote by Br. Jose Mari Jimenez on collective action. In the afternoon, the delegates visited both La Salle Primary School and La Salle College.


